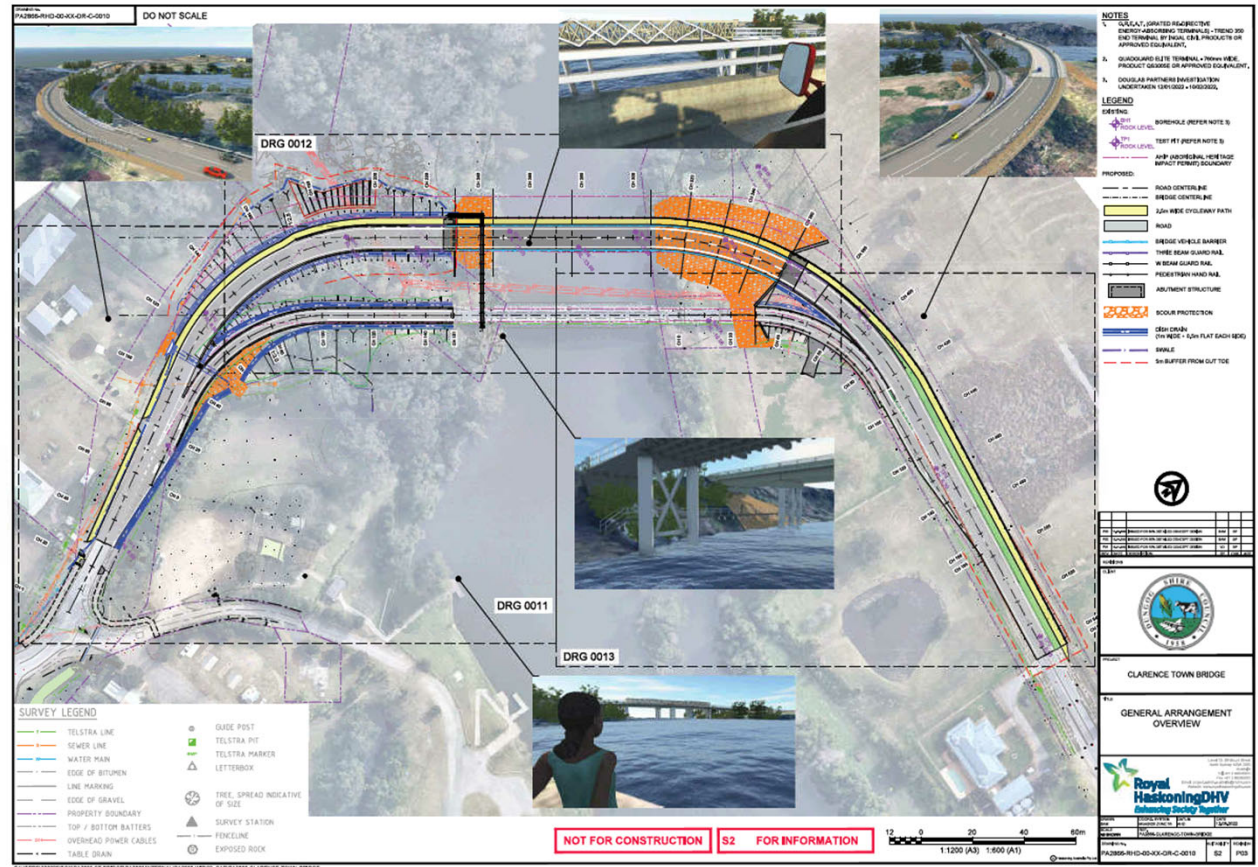




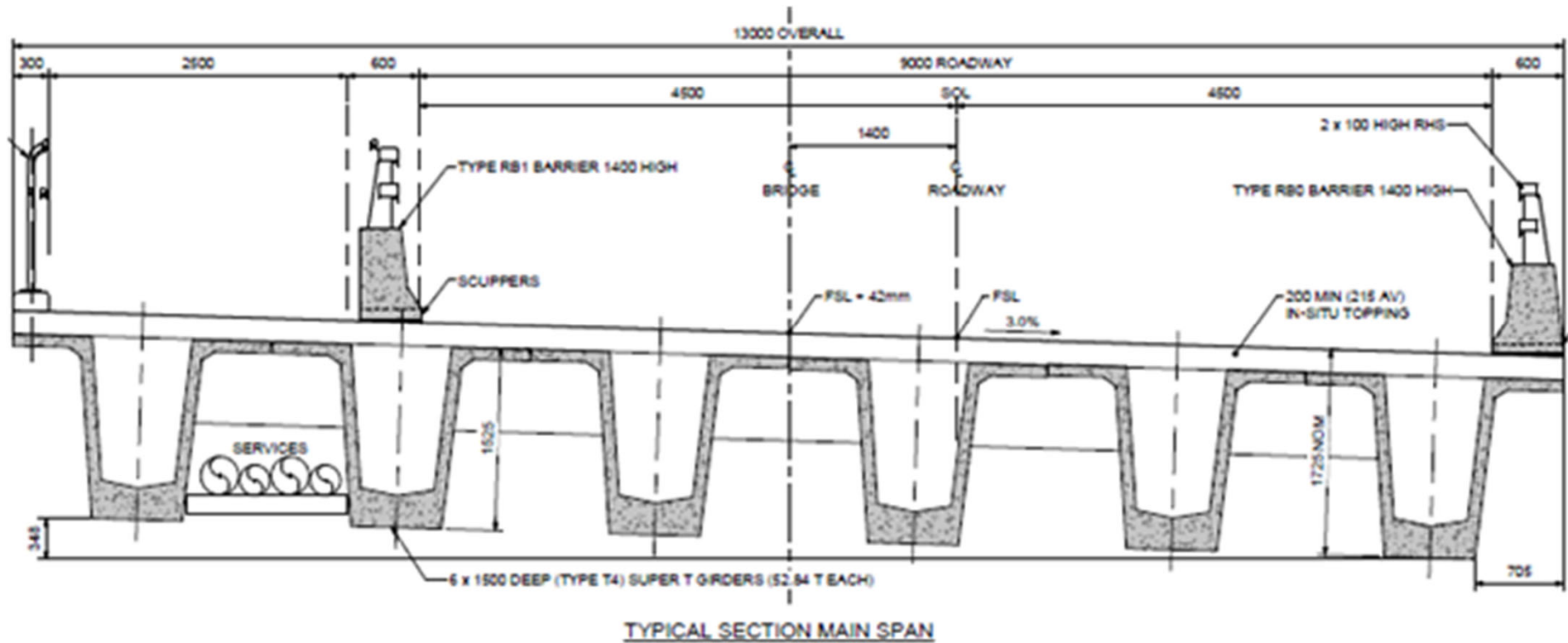
# Concept Plan

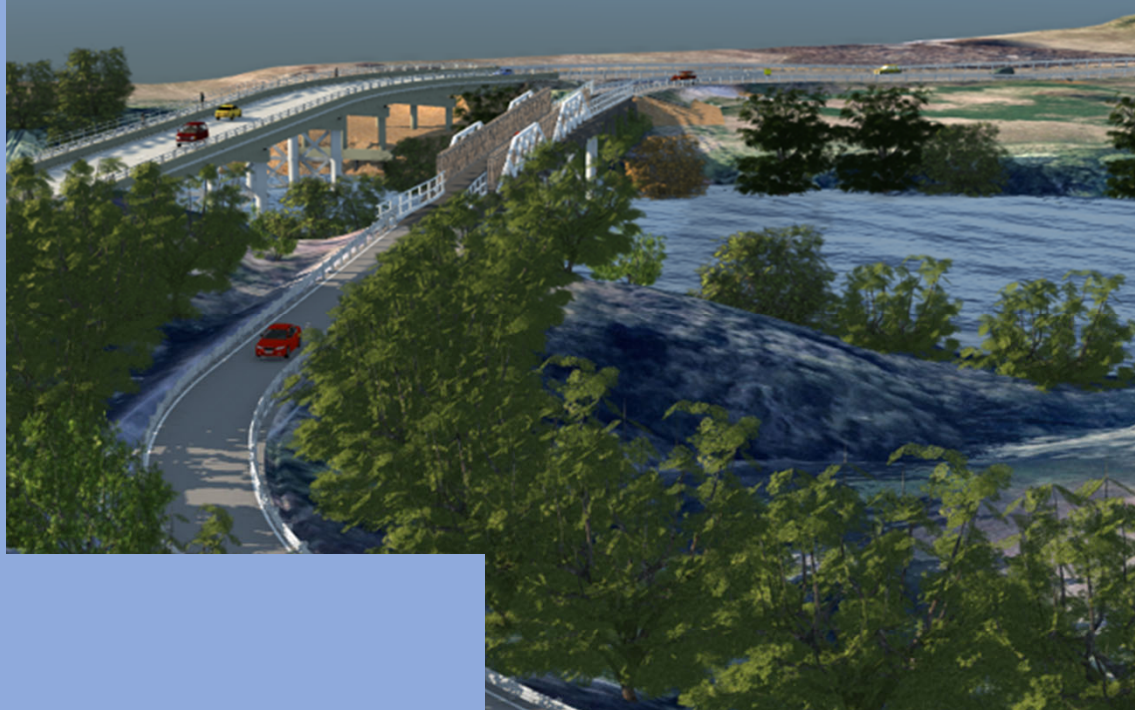
# Concept Plan

- Bridge length approximately 135m;
- Two travel lanes, 8.8m in width;
- Pedestrian walkway/cycleway;
- Bridge approaches;
- Associated civil works.

The funding breakdown for the project is shown below:-

\$9.581M Federal Government Grant;

\$5.5M NSW Government Fixing Country Roads Program;

\$5.5M Transport for NSW.

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# Construction Impact

Construction Impacts will include:-

- Impact on Traffic Flow;
- Construction Traffic;
- Access to Lions Park and associated facilities;
- Access to Bridge Reserve, Williams River Holiday Park and associated facilities;
- Noise;
- Dust;
- River impacts and access to waterway;
- Flooding during works

# Existing Brig O'Johnston Bridge

- Transport for NSW will continue to manage the existing Brig O'Johnston Bridge during the development of the proposed new structure and following completion of the project.
- Routine maintenance and scheduled rehabilitation work will continue on Brig O'Johnston Bridge during this time.



# Existing Brig O'Johnston Bridge

- Transport for NSW will continue to work with Council during the construction of the proposed new structure to ensure work is coordinated and disruption to the community is minimised.
- Transport for NSW is working with NSW Environment, Energy and Science on progressing towards a formal application to approve the rehabilitation of the Brig O'Johnston Bridge. Following approval, an environmental assessment and delivery options will be prepared for consultation with the community.

- Expected Construction Program – 18 Months.
